Often there are statements made correlating a profession and the date of birth of those within it. Chiropractic in the Northwest. Achievement of this status will expand the number of states in which W.S.C.C. graduates may be licensed, as many are requiring graduation from fully accredited Chiropractic colleges. Also, the financial assistance which will be forthcoming from A.C.A. upon and after attainment of full accreditation will be significant in the future of our Alma Mater.

The Alumni activities this year are dedicated to the purpose of meeting these needs for full accreditation. The biggest job is to meet the financial responsibility requirements. Enough assets must be available to insure graduation of the Freshman class. To reach this goal, \$30,000 additional funds or other assets must be raised. Over 1/4 of this "new money" has been raised and the remainder is needed by January 1973--just over two months from now.

Doctors and friends of WSCC and Chiropractic, NOW is the time for us to put our concerted effort into the fund raising projects which have been established to meet these immediate needs and to keep increasing the size of the W.S.C.C. Endowment Fund. This is that we can do.

1. Urge others (doctors, patients, friends) to participate in fund raising and to make large personal

contributions.

2. Promote actively the \$1.00 a month donation program with patients and others.

3. Make a significant personal contribution of cash, property or other assets. As a guide, it is suggested that practicing Doctors donate \$1,000 or \$100 for each year in practice for the newer practitioners.
