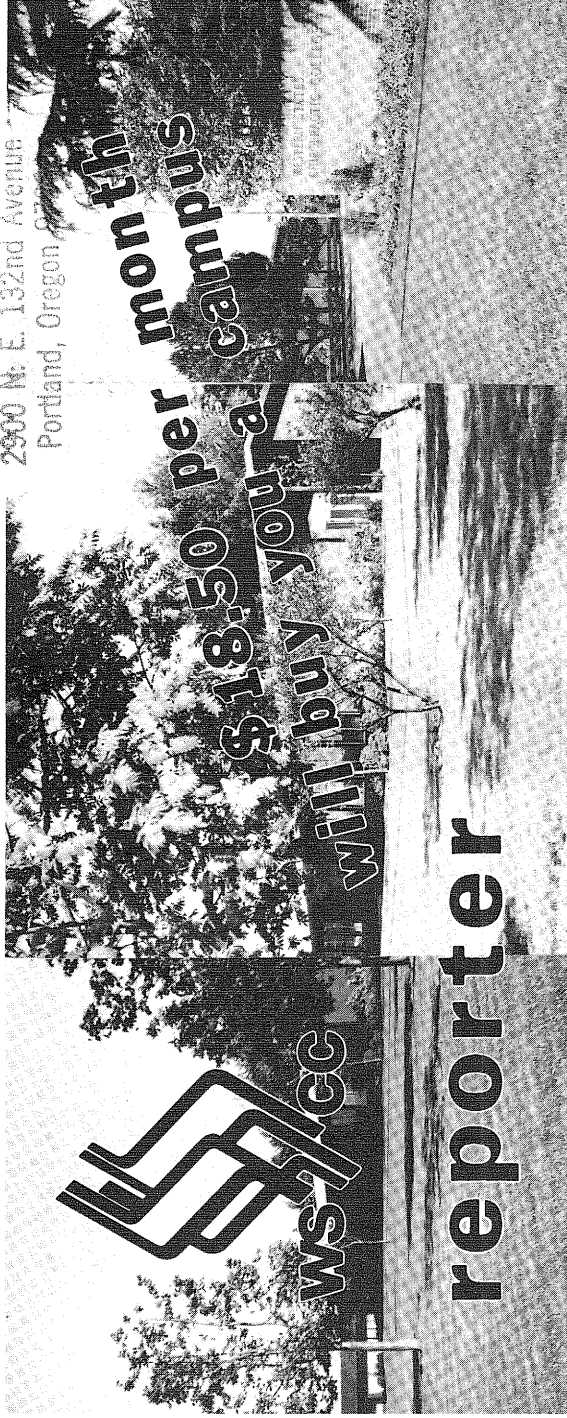

H.E.W. ELIGIBILITY RECEIVED

As a result of the correspondent status with the Council on Chiropractic Education, Western States Chiropractic College received its eligibility number from the United States Office of Education recently.

With only days to go for a deadline on the 1975 application for student funds the college hired a student, Mr. Robert Cother, as the Student Financial Aids Officer. Mr. Cother has received his B.A. in Mathematics from Occidental College and an M.A. in Counseling from San Diego State College. He has had one year of experience in student financial aid at San Diego State College. He has also had experience as a counselor at Mt. Miguel High School in San Diego, California and served for five years as Director of Guidance and Student Services at Bend Senior High School in Bend, Oregon.

It was a great stroke of luck to have Mr. Cother in our midst when we received the materials required for participation in the Federal programs now available. Cother knew the forms, had knowledge of the people in Oregon that could be helpful, and he agreed to pick up the ball and run with it.

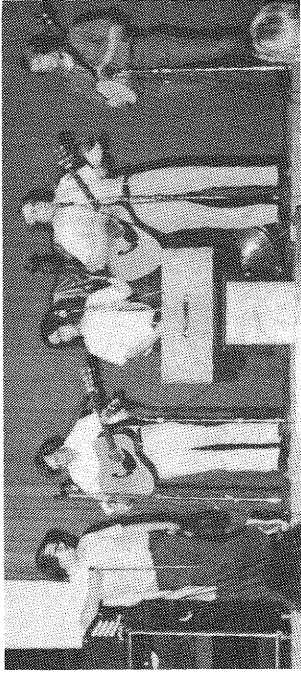


TUITION INCREASE

The Board of the Health Research Foundation at a recent meeting, set the tuition for new students entering Western States Chiropractic College in the Spring of 1975 and for all students in the fall of 1975 at \$625.00 per quarter.

After a careful study, including help from the auditing firm, it was decided this increase would be feasible for the current operating budget and it is fairly close to the fees charged by other chiropractic colleges.

Future tuition increases will be determined by the inflationary cost of living raises that will affect the normal operation of the college. No graduated scale has been set and each necessary raise will meet with careful study by the board.

The Chiropractic Bed Set drawing was held on A.C.A. day and the winner of the set was Mrs. John Piper of Portland, wife of Dr. John Piper.

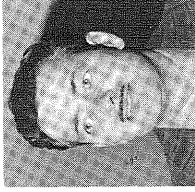

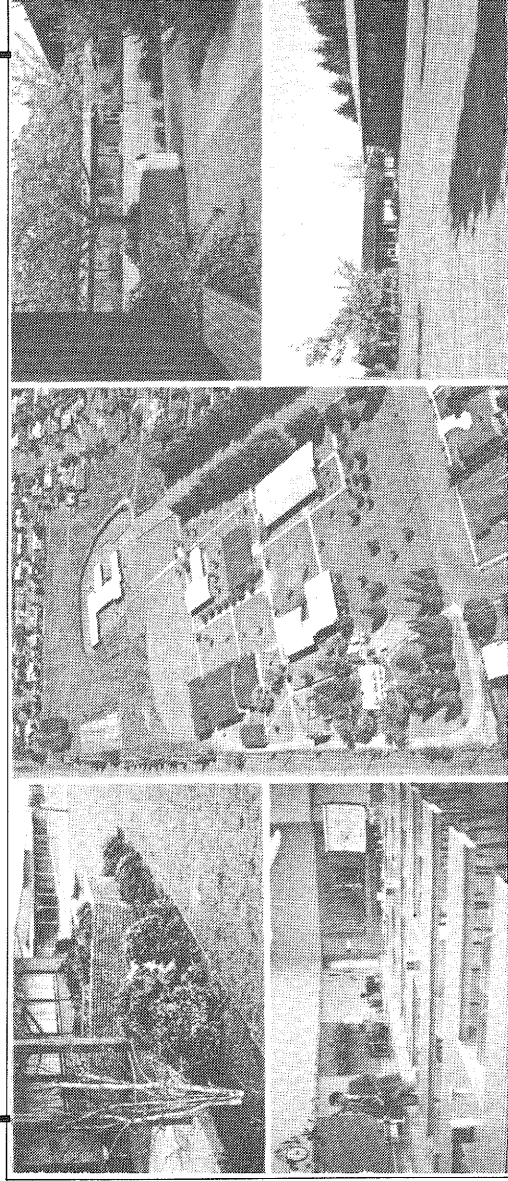
With the knowledge that we are an accepted educational institution with the United States Office of Education, more doors will be opened and those that were tightly closed in the past will be more easily opened.

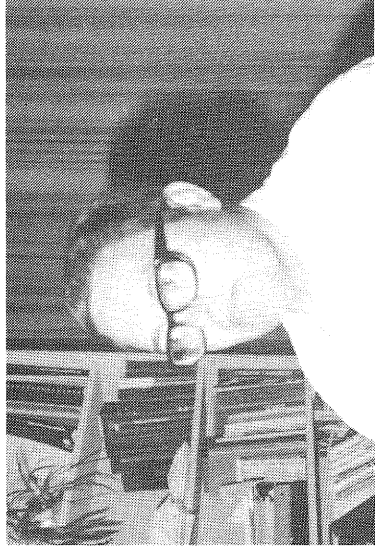

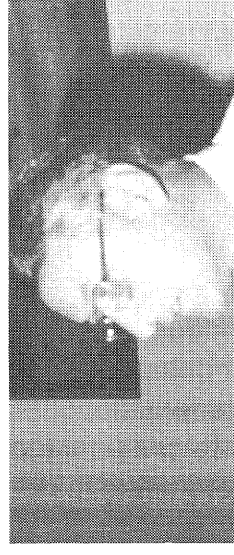

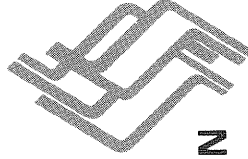
