RESOLUTION

Western States Chiropractic College

- WHEREAS, Western States Chiropractic College submitted a self-study in application for accredited status to the Commission on Accreditation, and
- WHEREAS, The Commission on Accreditation sent an evaluation team to visit the Western States Chiropractic College on November 3,4 and 5,1980; and
- WHEREAS, The evaluation team submitted a report of its findings to the Commission on Accreditation which was considered at a hearing on January 23 1981;
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Commission on Accreditation hereby grants the Western States Chiropractic College Accredited status for a period of three years;
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that progress reports are to be submitted on a semi-annual basis and these reports should concern them-selves with the weaknesses noted in the evaluation team report with special consideration to the following concerns:
 - 1. Excessive reliance upon tuition to meet educational and general expenses.
 - 2. Need to expend more effort to delegate responsibilities presently concentrated with the chief administrator
 - 3. Need for greater attention to long range planning
 - 4. Lack of faculty involvement in research
 - 5. Greater need for post-graduate involvement.
