### CCE ACCREDITATION

Western States was granted Accredited Status by the Council on Chiropractic Education (CCE) on January 23, 1981. As with most institutions receiving Accredited Status for the first time, Western States holds this status until January of 1984. Prior to that time, the College must undergo a complete self-study and host an on-site visitation team. The College has become expert in self-study reporting, having produced four such reports in the past five years. The necessary report for reaccreditation has been completed and will be mailed April 11. A visitation team, named by the Commission on Accreditation of CCE, will be on the Western States campus in October or November of this year. We are confident that we will be granted Accredited Status once again at the January 1984 meeting of CCE.
