

BE IT RESOLVED, that the following rule shall be adopted with regard to all students entering Western States Chiropractic College, effective June 1, 1974, and that such rule shall be placed in the catalog, and that all applications for matriculation shall contain reference to the rule specifically and shall be brought to the attention of every student:

PROVISIONAL STATUS OF ALL NEW STUDENTS

All students enrolling in Western States Chiropractic College, including transfers, shall be provisional students until they are accepted by the faculty as candidates for the degree of Doctor of Chiropractic.

With regard to the provisional students, the faculty of Western States Chiropractic College reserve the right to make a determination of the acceptability during the period of provisional status of any student as to the student's qualification to continue as a student in the Western States Chiropractic College.

The faculty will decide by a vote of two-thirds' majority whether the student in question shall be accepted as a candidate for the Degree of Doctor of Chiropractic. In the event the vote of the faculty by a two-thirds' majority is that he may continue as a student at the college, his status as a provisional student will terminate and he will then be a candidate for the Degree of Doctor of Chiropractic. In the event the student receives a vote of two-thirds of the faculty that he be not accepted as a candidate for the Degree of Doctor of Chiropractic, he shall be terminated as a student thereafter. The student's status shall be determined at the end of each academic year, but once a provisional student is granted the status of degree candidate, this status shall not be changed as long as the student maintains the minimum academic achievement required for graduation.

If a vote of the faculty is less than two-thirds, either to grant the student candidacy status or to terminate as a student, he may continue the following year as a provisional student; however, no degree shall be granted to a student who has not received a two-thirds' favorable vote of the faculty.

In determining whether to grant a student status as a degree candidate, the faculty must decide whether the provisional student has met the high standards of the Western States Chiropractic College, giving due regard to his meeting the college standards as to discipline, morality, attitude, acceptance of general theories of chiropractic as taught at Western States Chiropractic College, and whether in the opinion of the faculty the student should be entrusted with the awesome responsibility of being a Doctor of Chiropractic. The requirements set forth in this rule are in addition to the academic requirements of the college for continuation as a student and for the granting of the Degree of Doctor of Chiropractic.

In the event, at the end of any academic year, a student does not receive a two-thirds' vote of the faculty, removing him from provisional status and making him a candidate for the Degree of Doctor of Chiropractic, he shall be advised in writing of this fact and invited to discuss the matter with the President of the college or such faculty member as the President may designate.
