Student Dress

Most of you should be commended for a clean neat appearance. However, there have been a few students who have forgotten to wear appropriate clothing.

Perhaps we need to be reminded that the student body voted that each student should look "clean, neat and appropriate for the occasion." Free agency to dress as one chooses is a very important right. However, a student body has the right to maintain certain standards for the benefit of the entire body. When a few students choose to disregard dress standards they are really showing a lack of respect for their fellow students.

Dress Standards

The dress code was written by students and accepted by the student body in an election. The student dress code committee drew up a code which "allows for individual variation." Simply stated it says, "that students dress shall be clean, neat and appropriate to the occasion." Students are "mature enough to determine their own mode of dress within a reasonable framework." But there could be a problem of interpretation so the following rules are clearly stated. These are as follows:

1. Bare feet are not acceptable
2. Socks shall be worn with sandals.
3. T-shirts (white or colored) are not acceptable.
4. "Blue jeans" are not acceptable.
5. Work boots are not acceptable.
6. No limit on hair length, but should be kept neat.
7. For seminars, shirt and slacks or a dress or pant suits (defined as a matching pants and top.)
