COMMISSION ON ACCREDITATION

RESOLUTION

JANUARY 21, 1987

WESTERN STATES CHIROPRACTIC COLLEGE

- WHEREAS, Western States Chiropractic College submitted a Self-Study in application for renewal of Accredited status; and
- WHEREAS, the Commission on Accreditation sent an Evaluation Team to visit Western States Chiropractic College, October 6-8, 1986; and
- WHEREAS, the Evaluation Team submitted a report of findings to the Commission on Accreditation that was considered at a hearing with the Western States Chiropractic College on January 20, 1987;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Commission on Accreditation hereby grants the Western States Chiropractic College renewal of Accredited status for a period of 4 years;
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that via the submission of timely progress reports* the institution shall provide, to the Commission on Accreditation, a detailed analysis of the college's advances in the preparation of a working short, intermediate and long range plan inclusive of:
 - A) The college's marketing and recruitment program
 - B) The effect of enrollment on facilities, faculty, staff and research
 - C) The impact on the college's financial strength, and
 - D) Other component facts affecting the growth and/or strengthening of existing institutional programs.

The Commission on Accreditation is also concerned with, and would require the submission, to the C.O.A., of a Board policy with respect to the desirability, implementation and follow-up of research, as-well-as a formal policy which has been adopted with respect to the protection of animal and human rights by the college's Institutional Review Board.

The Commission requires in the college's progress report documentation which will validate the college's compliance with section B.1, Obligations, and section B.2, Responsibilities as they pertain to the Board.
